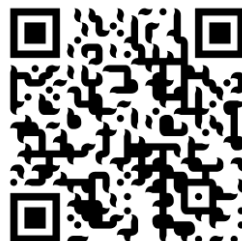

Sermon The Rev. Charles Lane Cowen

The Nicene Creed (*all say together*) BCP, 358

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Loving God, give us grace to serve Christ in one another, and love as he loves us. Give us vitality that we may serve you by serving our community.
Alleluia! May the power of your Resurrection enable us to act with unwavering faith.

Loving God, you are the comfort of all who sorrow, the strength of all who suffer in body, mind and spirit, and the liberator of the poor and the oppressed.
Alleluia! Show us your mercy, and give us the strength to serve one another, for the sake of Jesus Christ, who suffered for us.

Loving God, we pray for those who have died, [especially _____]. May you be glorified in all the saints.
Alleluia! In the promise of Resurrection, bring them into your heavenly kingdom, and transform our sorrow into joy.

Loving God, you know the prayers that are in our hearts and minds. We offer them to you now, silently or aloud.
